Updates from CAO John Pinsent:

Potential Acquisition of 99 Advance Avenue – Building Inspection Request

Council approved \$3,295 for McIntosh Perry to complete a Building Condition Assessment for 99 Advance Ave should the Town of Greater Napanee agree on a sales price with Family and Children's Services of Frontenac, Lennox and Addington to acquire the building. What's Happening in Our Municipal Departments:

Winter Parking Forgiveness Program

Council approved the proposed Winter Parking Forgiveness Program Policy. The Winter Parking Forgiveness Program Policy provides a standard for how donations can be taken in exchange for forgiving a parking ticket issued between the last Monday in November and the Friday before December 21 each year. The intention is to provide the community a channel to make a monetary or toy donation to contribute to the Fire Department's annual Toy Drive.



2022 Municipal Elections Information:

Nominations are open for the 2022 municipal and school board elections. Each week, the Town will update the information on [its website](#) to reflect the current candidate list. The deadline to register is Friday, August 19 at 2:00 p.m. You can run for office or vote in the election if you are:

- At least 18 years old on Voting Day (October 24);
- A Canadian citizen;
- A resident, owner or tenant of land within Greater Napanee (or your spouse is an owner or tenant of land); and
- Not otherwise disqualified under the Act.

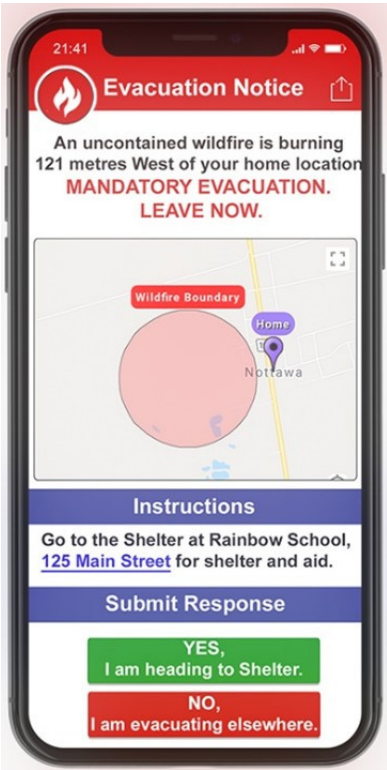
Residents are Encouraged to Subscribe to the Town's New Alert Notification System

An Open-Air Burning Permit is required for all open-air burning in Greater Napanee. Permits can be obtained online through the [Town's website](#). It is \$15 for an open-air burning permit. Permits are valid for 365 calendar days from the date of purchase. Once an Open-Air Burning Permit is purchased, **residents must call 1-833-411-8482** (the number provided on the online permit registration page) and register the location of the fire before doing any open-air burning.



The Town has partnered with the Canadian Internet Registration Authority (CIRA) to provide an Internet Speed Test to collect information relating to internet speeds.

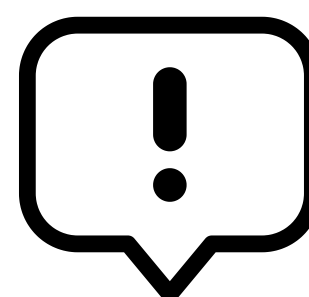
